## Riders on the Orphan Train at Kearney Public Library

Kearney Public Library welcomes novelist and Humanities Scholar <u>Alison Moore</u> and singer/songwriter <u>Phil Lancaster</u> for a multi-media presentation about Riders on the Orphan Train, Tuesday, July 19 at 7:00 p.m. at Kearney Public Library. Their program tells the story of the 250,000 orphans and unwanted children who were put on trains in New York between 1854 and 1929 and sent all over the United States to be given away. The presentation is comprised of original music, an audio-visual presentation of archival photographs and interviews with two surviving orphan train riders (a man who came to Berryville, AR and a woman who came to Greenville, TX).
