Brown Bag History Series - “Intentional Excess: the Frank Mansion’s Deliberate Design as a Path to Prosperity” presented by April White at the Kearney Public Library

Kearney Public Library and UNK-History Department welcome you to the history brown bag lunch series Wednesday, January 5 from noon-1:00 p.m. April White will present “Intentional Excess: the Frank Mansion’s Deliberate Design as a Path to Prosperity.”

Built in 1889, the Gilded Age mansion that currently houses the G.W. Frank Museum of History and Culture is an extraordinary tribute to strategic architectural design. Opulent details throughout the house did not just reflect the Frank family’s wealth and success. Design details were deliberately chosen and literally helped the Franks build a business empire. Frank Museum Director April White will discuss how the Frank Museum’s deliberate design choices cleverly added to the Frank’s success in the Kearney area.

April White has a Master of Arts in American History, a Bachelor of Arts in Art History, and has worked extensively at museums in the Kearney area. April currently serves as Director of the G.W. Frank Museum of History and Culture, and adjuncts part time in the UNK History Department.
